

GUIDELINES FOR COORDINATED MASTER'S DEGREE PROGRAMS

- A. The degree requirements of each constituent program must be satisfied.
- B. The total credits of the coordinated program must be equal to or greater than the sum of the credits required for each independent degree program, minus the sum of the free elective credits (those credits originally taken outside of the department/program, or otherwise unspecified) for both programs.
- C. Each proposed coordinated degree program must include at the minimum, a combined total of 42 credits of courses offered by the two constituent graduate degree programs.
- D. Proposals for coordinated programs will follow the format required for revision of existing graduate programs.
